# President Obama nominates John B. King, Jr. as U.S. Secretary of Education

**P**resident Obama has nominated John B. King, Jr. as U.S. Secretary of Education in light of the current Secretary, Arne Duncan's announcement to resign as of the end of December.

"John is an extraordinary leader who has dedicated his life to improving the opportunities of our young people, as a teacher, a school leader, and a leader of school systems," Duncan has said. "His passion, his fierce intelligence, and his clear understanding of the difficult but vital work of education change will be an enormous benefit to this Department and to the nation."

As a leader of ambitious education change in New York State, King brings a lifelong record of commitment to improving education for all students, and especially for the most vulnerable. King, a former social studies teacher who was named New York's education chief in 2011, has overseen a number of key initiatives that have transformed teaching and learning across the state. He led the transition to rigorous academic standards that prepare students for college, careers and life and expanded career and technical education by creating multiple pathways to high school graduation that give students more opportunities to pursue their passions.

King, the first African-American and the first person of Puerto Rican descent to hold the education commissioner's office in New York, earned his undergraduate degree from Harvard University, his master's in teaching of social studies from Columbia University, his law degree from Yale University and his education doctorate from Columbia University. He often points to education—and teachers, in particular—as what saved him after he lost both of his parents to illness by the time he was 12. His parents were both educators.

#### Student Immersion Wochenende am Genevasee

On Friday, October 9, 2015, the Student German Immersion Weekend began at Lake Geneva, Wisconsin. It was a cooperative initiative run by Niles Township High Schools District 219 and Concordia Language Villages, Waldsee. Students of any level will use their language skills to develop a deeper understanding of and enthusiasm for German. The weekend involves interactive language learning activities, Waldseeart, including authentic games, arts, sports, dance, music and traditions. These time proven Waldsee methodologies have empowered young learners of German for decades and we are thrilled to provide this amazing opportunity so close to home! Participating teachers will also receive 18 Illinois CEU's towards professional development. Student registration cost between May 4 - September 11 was \$185, from September 12 - October 1 \$195. Teacher cost was \$95 including 18 Illinois Professional Development Hours. All fees are fully refundable up until the October 1st deadline! Start planning to have your German students attend next year in 2016.
